For 80 years, RAA has been facilitating opportunities, increasing access, maintaining collaborative relationships and providing timely support to celebrate Australian stories across art forms and across landscapes.



REGIONAL STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK



The overarching RAA Regional Strategic Framework responds to the discoveries and conversations from the biennial Creative Regional National Summit and Artlands, which is programmed each alternate year.

The framework aims to integrate creative partnerships across industries, including tourism, hospitality, manufacturing, agricultural and technology. It also seeks to strengthen the creative and cultural ecology by creating place-based connections across art forms, communities and landscapes.

- Cultural and social infrastructure and connectivity
- Collaborations and partnerships
- Innovation and new thinking
